## CRIME WATCH MIKE MCPHILLIPS

Greetings neighbors. Welcome back to those who traveled to exotic destinations this summer and have returned to our little slice of paradise. While the travelers were absent these past few months, little of any significance has occurred here in our community. Although, the Martin County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) has been quite busy apprehending miscreants and major criminals in the area including a would-be assassin of former President Trump recently. You may have seen the apprehension on I-95 on the national news.

Additionally, the MCSO combined their civilian intelligence group, and the neighborhood watch organization meeting once a month on the second Thursday of the month at 6:00 p.m. at the Sheriff's office on Monterey. Each month officers of the MCSO provide a recap of crime trends across Martin County. Representatives from the various divisions of the department also provide information about their functions and discuss the duties they have in the department.

Further, Sheriff's representatives including command staff break down crime activity across the county in each of their patrol districts. Over the last few months, the department has made apprehensions of perpetrators of "bank jugging" where criminals are casing local banks watching for bank customers exiting the bank with cash withdrawals. The crooks followed the customers and subsequently robbed them after disabling the customer's vehicle. We learned that there have been reports of several south American gangs operating in the county and the MCSO has been monitoring their activities and arresting individuals involved in crimes.

Recently, there have been reported thefts of mail in our immediate area from postal facilities. The culprits have rifled through the stolen mail looking for checks. They have been "washing" checks changing the entity of "pay to the order of" and the amount of the checks. It is recommended that anyone who uses checks to pay bills should keep a close eye on the transactions in their bank accounts. Finally, just as a reminder, when witnessing a crime or suspicious activity, call the MCSO immediately to report the activity by calling 9-1-1.

You should advise the radio dispatcher what, when, and where along with a detailed description of the individuals involved, what they are wearing and a description of the vehicle being used including make, model and color of the vehicle.

In closing, stay safe, stay alert and stay well. We are enclosing a copy of the telephone numbers for the Martin County Sheriff's Office.

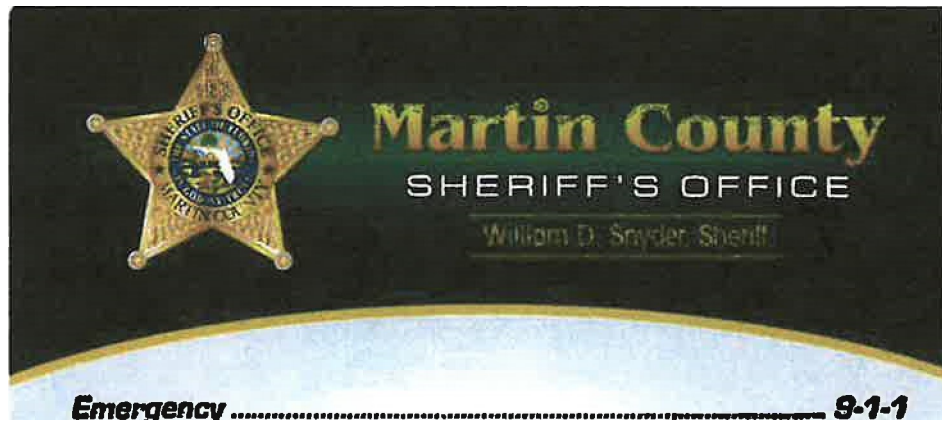
