**Manager's Corner

I want to do a little Conquistador civics lesson. If you own a home, you belong to one master homeowners' association and are governed by the Conquistador HOA set of governing documents. If you are a condo unit owner, you belong to two associations: 1) the Conquistador HOA, the master association and 2) the condo association where you live, and you are governed by your condo association set of governing documents and the Conquistador HOA set of governing documents.

Each condo association has an annual meeting every year, and the master HOA has an annual meeting on the first Friday of December every year. This year it is on 12/6/24 at 10AM.

The condos just finished having their annual meetings and part of those meetings was at least one vote per association. This year, the common vote for all condo associations was the color palette which was approved by the master association and forwarded on to the condo associations for their approval through a vote of their membership (you).

The master association, CHA also typically has at least one vote per year. This year that vote is for the community document revisions approved by the Board of Directors and now forwarded to membership (you).

As the community just started electronic voting this year, residents who signed a consent to receive correspondence and vote electronically voted electronically via an e mail that came from vote@voteegrity.net. If you are a condo unit owner, you will receive two e-mails from vote@voteegrity.net, one for your condo association vote and another for your master association vote so **home owners should have completed one vote and condo unit owners should have completed two votes**. There are vote limits that must be reached for items to pass so every vote counts!!!! If you have not participated in any or just one of the votes, there is still time. The votes have been left open to give residents more time to vote. They will close on 12/6/24 so:

January Book Club

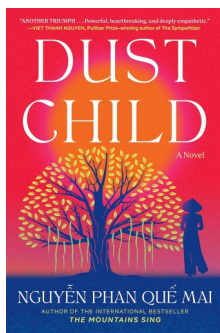
Wednesday, January 8, 2025 in the Card Room at 6:30 PM. I've received many positive comments about this book from residents that are presently reading it or

CONQUISTADOR NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME WATCH

Greetings, neighbors. This month I wanted to cover a couple of topics of importance to all of us. First, after two security surveys conducted over the last several years by the Martin County Sheriff's Officer (MCSO) crime prevention specialist recommending improved lighting throughout the community. Our ad-hoc lighting committee is working on a plan to do just that.

Having said that, it won't come too soon. As some of you may be aware, last night our little paradise was disturbed by three youths running in the neighborhood banging on homeowners' doors and running off. The intruders made their way along Coronado Ln., Gran Via Way and Granada Ln. after dark banging on doors. Subsequently, the MCSO was contacted responding to Conquistador and ultimately looking for the miscreants. To our knowledge, MCSO officers were unable to locate the individuals responsible for the disturbance. We do not know if the culprits were intending to break into a home or were just pranksters, but the result was that the incident left several of our residents traumatized. That is not acceptable!

I am currently in the process of following up with MCSO.

We may all remember from history that policing was founded in England almost two hundred years ago by Sir Robert Peel, Lt. Colonel Rowan and a lesser known "Irish barrister" named Richard Mayne. According to my *old* National Crime Prevention Materials regarding the history of the Metropolitan Police, "the first duty of a Constable is always to prevent the commission of a crime." To accomplish this goal the police then and today need the complete cooperation of the community. We need to underscore this concept. The community must take steps to first be able to recognize the importance of working together to provide proper lighting and target hardening but also report suspicious activity promptly to the police.

There is no excuse for complacency or apathy because after a tragedy it is too late.
