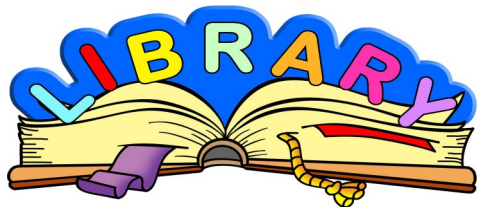

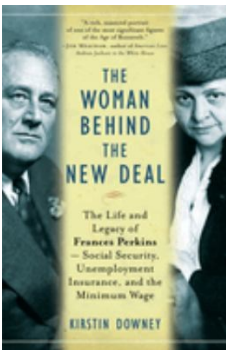

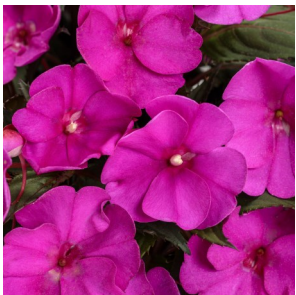

CONQUISTADOR NEIGHBORHOOD

CRIME WATCH

Greetings neighbors, by the time you get this you may be back to paradise. Hopefully everyone has had a great holiday. I suspect some of you have joined me with our new diets. Just kidding...but it always seems like my belt tightens a bit over Christmas and Thanksgiving.

Earlier in December, the Martin County Crime Watch met at the Martin County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) where we were informed of current crime trends throughout Martin County. I have reported in the past that "bank juggings" have occurred at some of our banks. Apparently the MCSO has received reports of offenders recently attacking unsuspecting victims. Always be aware of your surroundings when banking and returning to your cars. Do not display cash as you leave a bank and do not leave large amounts of cash in your autos.



We also learned that crooks are monitoring our parks and beaches. After victims walk away from their autos, subjects are breaking into cars popping trunks and stealing the contents. Again beware of your surroundings. If you see something suspicious call the MCSO.

If you receive a text message or an email with regard to a technical issue on your computer, do not call a number in the message. It could be a scam. Call your provider.

Many times thieves have set up phony numbers for tech support that will come up in a Google search. Beware, thieves want access to your computer.

On Saturday January 25th between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., MCSO will be conducting a shred event along with a medical take back service, at the Sheriff's office, at 800 SE Monterey Rd., in Stuart. Residents can bring up to three banker's boxes for shredding which will be processed by a shredding vehicle right there in the parking lot. If you have more documents the Sheriff's department would appreciate a small donation. In the past the shredding project has been very well attended. It seems like the best time to arrive is around 11:30.

Finally, a couple of reminders for our residents: If you observe something suspicious, call the MCSO office to report the activity by dialing 9-1-1 immediately. Remember to note a detailed description of the individual and the vehicle if involved including the make, model, color of the vehicle and the license number. And, probably most importantly, please remember to wear light colored clothing or something reflective while walking in low light conditions at night or just before darkness. This is a senior's community and you are risking your life if you do not take precautions. We cannot see you! Stay well and stay safe!
